The 2018-19 Strategic Budget was reviewed: Any remaining funds are used to purchase supplies.

Staffing for next year:

K – 129 (21) – 6 teachers (We currently have 8); 1st – 123 (20) – 6 teachers (We currently have 7)

2nd – 129 (20) – 5 teachers (We currently have 7); 3rd – 122 (23) – 5 teachers (We currently have 7)

4th – 137 (33.5) – 4 teachers (We currently have 5); 5th – 127 (33.5) – 4 teachers (We currently have 4)

Humanities (Technology & Science) will go from 2 to 1 teacher

Special Programs such as DHH, Resource, Speech, Autism and Early Childhood do not come out of school budget

4.1 SCHOOL PERFORMANCE PLAN. Data Progress Reviewed

-Schorr scored 79.5 points earning a 4 Star rating

4 Star school: Recognizes a commendable school that has performed well of all students and subgroups.

A four star school demonstrates satisfactory to strong academic performance for all students. Further, the school is successfully promoting academic progress for all student groups as reflected in closing opportunity gaps. The school does not fail to meet expectations for any group on any indicator. Schools identified for targeted support and improvement are not eligible to be classified as a four star school or higher. (As defined by the Nevada School Rating System)

-Subgroup percentages were reviewed for Math and ELA as identified by SPP goals.

-The percentage of Chronically Absent subgroups were the highest for Black/African American-17% and Pacific Islanders 12.2%. The Schorr Attendance Program will review its data and identify students who would benefit from participating.
